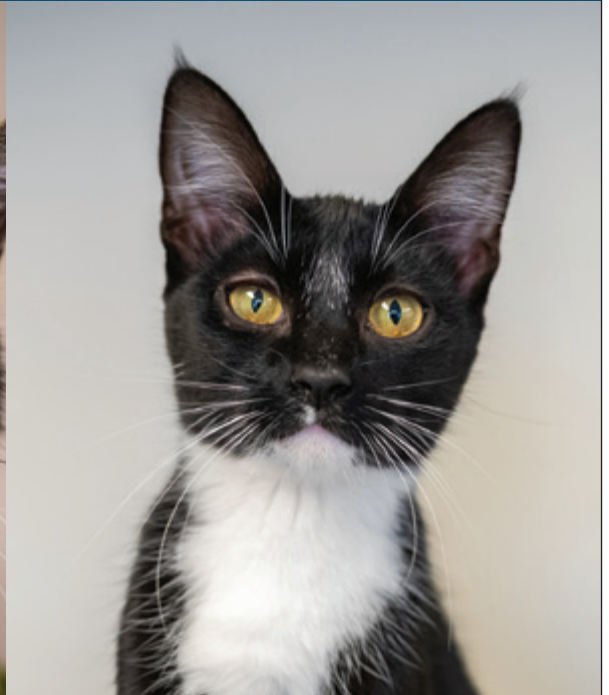

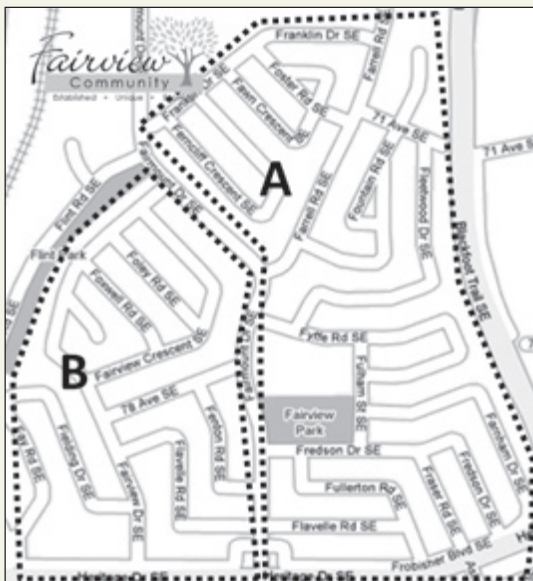

# Free Home and Yard Maintenance Services for Fairview Seniors

Did you know that eligible older adults in Fairview can receive professional help with lawn mowing, snow shoveling, and light housekeeping at zero direct cost?

Through the City of Calgary's Home Services for Seniors Program, trusted local service providers handle these physically demanding household tasks so you can continue living safely, comfortably, and independently at home. While the City coordinates and schedules the contractors, the service is fully funded by the provincial government. Approved costs are billed directly to the Government of Alberta's Special Needs Assistance for Seniors (SNA) program on your behalf, meaning you will never receive an out-of-pocket bill.

## Who Qualifies?

To be eligible for these fully subsidized home services, applicants must meet the following criteria:

- Age: Be 65 years of age or older.
- Residency: Live within Calgary city limits (right here in Fairview).
- Financial: Qualify for the provincial Special Needs Assistance for Seniors (SNA) program. *(Note: Income eligibility is determined by the province rather than standard municipal Fair Entry thresholds).*

## How to Apply

Applications are handled through Calgary's Fair Entry program, which streamlines access to multiple city subsidies.

1. Gather Documents: You will need proof of your age, Calgary residency (such as a utility bill), and your Personal Health Number.
2. Submit Application: Apply online at [calgary.ca/fairentry](http://calgary.ca/fairentry), drop off your forms in person at any municipal Fair Entry location, or send them via mail or fax.
3. Crucial Step: On the Fair Entry application form, ensure you check the specific box for "snow shoveling, grass cutting, housekeeping for seniors 65+."

Once Fair Entry processes your initial application, they will refer you to the program staff to set up your services.

# Community First: Highlights from the 2026 FCA Annual General Meeting

On Tuesday, June 9, 2026, neighbours and Board members gathered virtually for the Fairview Community Association's (FCA) Annual General Meeting (AGM). The evening provided a wonderful opportunity to reflect on a remarkable year of community events, share important neighbourhood updates, and plan for the future of Fairview. The FCA was also pleased to welcome special guests, including Ward 11 Councillor Rob Ward, Calgary Acadia MLA Diana Batten, and Constable Mike Colbert from the Calgary Police Service.

## A Year of Celebration and Success

Acting President Wayne McNeely opened the meeting by highlighting the incredible efforts of local volunteers over the past year. A major highlight was the door-to-door membership drive that reached over 1,200 homes—bringing total enrollment to 194 paid members—and the successful rollout of the Zeffy online platform for easier membership signups. Residents enjoyed a variety of standout activities, including the Spring Fling, the Parade of Garage Sales, the Community Bottle Drive, Bowling with Santa, and the spectacular 65<sup>th</sup> anniversary double feature Movie in the Park! Heartfelt thanks were extended to every volunteer who helped throughout the year — whether that meant organizing events, helping with setup and cleanup, flooding the rink, delivering flyers, serving food, helping at movie night, supporting the 55+ Collective, or simply showing up when help was needed! A special callout to our Rinkmaster Jason Mohler and his team for their dedication to maintaining the outdoor skating rinks at Flavelle Park despite seasonal challenges.

## Financial and Neighbourhood Updates

The Association remains in excellent financial health, closing the fiscal year with a small profit of \$1,792 and maintaining stable general and gaming funds. The annual audit completed by the Federation of Calgary Communities concluded with zero irregularities found.

In community safety, Constable Colbert shared that Fairview remains a very safe, low-crime neighbourhood. Traffic safety continues to be a primary focus, and residents are strongly encouraged to log traffic and commercial vehicle concerns via 3-1-1 to provide

actionable data to the City. To help address these issues, community member Shauna Murphy is kick starting a new network to connect community residents interested in traffic safety advocacy. Regarding infrastructure, Councillor Ward shared updates on exploring future community facility options. Meanwhile, the FCA development committee continues to look out for neighbourhood interests, having actively reviewed 37 city planning applications this past year!

## Board Transitions and Opportunities to Step Up

We extended a heartfelt thank you to Les Sorenson, who is stepping down from the board after several years of exceptional service. Les has been an absolute powerhouse for Fairview, masterfully juggling his role as Treasurer while also managing community emails, communications, and our 55+ programming. The entire community is incredibly grateful for his tireless dedication and massive contributions—thank you, Les!

The FCA is thrilled to welcome its newly elected Board and Executive team, including Laura Eeckhout stepping up as the new Treasurer and Joy Lusk taking over as Communications Director.

We are also incredibly fortunate to have strong continuity and leadership moving forward, as Wayne McNeely, Garrett Mazurenko, Dave Eisenbart, Ralph Schempp, Nicole McNeely, Stacie Padbury, Jon Mazur, Laura Eeckhout, and Joy Lusk all remain committed to serving as Board Members.

However, key positions—including the role of President—remain vacant, and there is an urgent need for more volunteers to help coordinate events like the 55+ Collective seniors programming. If you want to support this fantastic team, please reach out over the summer to see how you can get involved!

If you want to make a difference in Fairview, you can choose your own level of involvement. The Board meets just once a month from September to June, with open roles requiring only a few hours a week or month. We are also looking for general volunteers who can lend a hand at individual events without joining the board.

# Heat-Related Illness

ALTA Paramedic Health would like to remind everyone to stay safe in the heat and sun this season. While children, older adults, and individuals with underlying health conditions may be more susceptible to the effects of heat and sun, everyone should take basic preventive measures to avoid heat-related illness during periods of hot, humid weather. Text HEAT to 88111 to receive tips on heat safety.

### Heat Exhaustion

- Heat exhaustion can occur due to excessive fluid loss during prolonged sweating in a hot and/or humid environment (indoors or outdoors).
- Symptoms may include headache, weakness, fatigue, nausea/vomiting, thirst, chills, and profuse sweating.
- The person is often cool and damp to the touch, and the skin may appear pale or dusky grey.

### Heat Stroke

- Heat stroke is a medical emergency and, without prompt treatment, can be fatal.
- It occurs when the body is unable to regulate its temperature (e.g., through sweating), causing body

temperature to rise to dangerous levels.

- Due to severe dehydration and failure of the cooling system, the skin may appear hot, dry, and flushed.

### First Aid

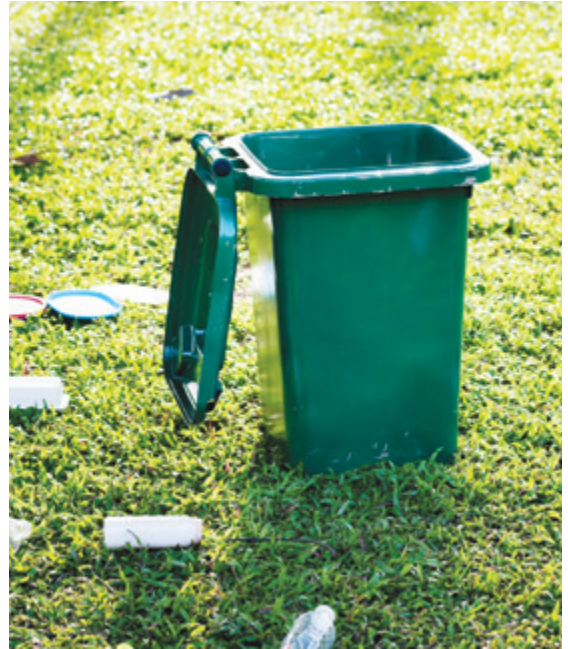
- First aid for all heat-related illness begins with removing or sheltering the person from the hot environment.
- Remove excess or tight-fitting clothing and allow the person to rest in a cool environment.
- If the person is conscious and alert, provide suitable fluids such as water, juice, or a sports drink.
- If you are concerned, seek medical attention.

### Prevention

- Stay well hydrated by drinking water regularly.
- Be aware that excessive alcohol and caffeine consumption may contribute to dehydration.
- Wear a broad-brimmed hat to protect your face and neck from the sun.
- Apply (and reapply) water-resistant sunscreen with a minimum SPF of 30+, especially for children.
- The sun's UV rays peak between 11:00 am and 3:00 pm, even on cloudy days.

## Green Bins Are for Food Scraps and Yard Waste

Food scraps belong in the green cart, but packaging does not. Plastic does not compost and can break into small pieces during processing, which can contaminate the finished compost. All food scraps must be separated from packaging before composting, even if the packaging says it is biodegradable or compostable.

A few simple habits can make a big difference:

- Remove all plastic before putting food scraps in the green bin.
- Empty and clean plastic, glass, and metal containers go in the blue cart.
- Plastic wraps, foam, and other non-compostable packaging belong in the black cart.

Putting food scraps in the green cart and packaging in the right bin helps keep compost clean. If you are not sure where an item goes, visit <https://www.calgary.ca/waste/what-goes-where/default.html>.
