

Accidental Poisoning

Emergency Medical Services (EMS) would like to remind parents and caregivers of precautions they can take to prevent accidental childhood poisonings around the home. Ingesting prescription or over the counter (OTC) medications is a significant cause of accidental childhood poisonings. Other causes include ingesting or contact with household items such as dishwasher or laundry tablets, mouthwash, or chemicals such as paints, solvents, or cleaning products.

Medication Storage

- Place all medications in locked containers and store in an area inaccessible to children.
- For easy identification, store all medications in their original packaging; do not mix multiple medications in a single bottle.
- Install child locks on all cabinets or drawers where medications are stored.

Safety Tips

- Child-resistant medication bottles are not child proof. They can still be opened by a child.
- Take extra precaution with medicines designed to appeal to children such as chewable vitamins or flavored cough and cold syrups.
- Promptly dispose of any medications or toxic household products no longer in use.

Prevention

- Store household products, cleaning supplies, and cosmetics in locked cabinets or drawers.
- Install child latches on cabinets children might also access by climbing on counters or chairs.
- Label all plants in and around your home and garden.
- Antifreeze, windshield washer fluid, and pesticides are extremely poisonous. Even small amounts of these can cause serious illness if ingested.

Poisoning information can be obtained by calling the Poison and Drug Information Service (PADIS) at: 1-800-332-1414.

In case of a poisoning emergency, call 911.

Provide the name of the product ingested and, if it is safe to do so, a sample of the substance for EMS to inspect on their arrival.

Cleaning Out the Garage This Summer?

When cleaning up the garage, put that waste in the right place. Here are some tips:

- Old garden hoses, rope, and electrical cords. Put in the garbage. They can't be recycled and create major tangles at the recycling facility, causing delays and equipment damage.
- Broken patio furniture. Put smaller items like lawn chairs, stools, and side tables in your black cart.
- Chemicals, motor oil, paint, and propane tanks. Take to a household hazardous waste drop-off at City landfills or designated fire stations for safe disposal. Visit calgary.ca/hhw for locations.
- Power tools, electric lawn mowers, hedge trimmers, and weed whackers. Take to a City landfill for free recycling. Visit calgary.ca/landfill for locations.
- Scrap metal such as car parts, bicycle parts, metal shelving, and wheel rims. Take to a metal recycler or City landfill for recycling.

Avoid Hidden Fees When Booking Your Next Trip

Even when you carefully plan and budget for a vacation, additional travel expenses often crop up, thanks to a sneaky technique called drip pricing. BBB recommends the following tips to predict, prepare for, and even avoid the hidden travel fees buried in the fine print.

Identifying and Avoiding Hidden Travel Fees

- Watch out for resort fees. These fees sometimes called "destination fees" or "urban fees" are often not listed on hotel aggregator websites, which means you need to click through several pages to find the hotel's final price.
- Look for hospitality tax. Some cities charge hotel or hospitality taxes, which aren't included in the hotel's nightly rate.
- Not all airport shuttle services are free. Just because a hotel says it offers an airport shuttle service doesn't mean it is complementary.
- Find out about parking. Not all hotels offer free parking, so ensure this is included before you book, especially in high-traffic areas with limited parking space.
- Don't assume hotel amenities are complimentary.
 Poolside towels, early check-in, in-room snacks, and even a continental breakfast may not be included in your room rate.
- Pack as little as possible when flying. Avoid baggage fees by reducing your luggage to a single carry-on if possible.

- Find out precisely what is included in the price of your airline ticket. Picking your seats, for example, and even in-flight entertainment, headphones, snacks and beverages, airline pillows and blankets, and in-flight Wi-Fi are not always free services.
- Check in and print your boarding pass before going to the airport. Some airlines now charge steep fees to check you in and print a physical boarding pass at the airport.
- Understand your airline's change and cancellation rules. Many airlines advertise free cancellations and change policies, especially since COVID-19 made traveling much more unpredictable. However, there are usually time limits or other limitations.
- Don't get hit with roaming charges. If you are traveling outside your home country, don't forget to check with your cellular provider about roaming charges before you travel.
- Get the most from currency exchanges. Changing currency at the airport or a big hotel is not your best bet.
- Double-check visa and tourist fees. In a world recovering from a pandemic, many countries have revised the length and cost of their tourist visas. Canadians should visit this page on Canada.ca.

9 PM ROUTINE



Found in Fairview

You have likely seen this month's resident walking down your street with a giant yellow pole with the Scottish Rampant Flag proudly waving above his head. Likely, you didn't think much beyond "cool, this guy loves Scotland." Well, when I met with Ted the other day, I confess I didn't ask about his love for Scotland because I soon found out it wasn't a flag pole he was carrying, it was a pedestrian stick. Ted explained that he is an inventor, and the pedestrian stick is one of his creations. It is brilliant in colour and a brilliant idea. The yellow colour is visible to pretty much everyone, and the flag matches the colour of the stick. The pedestrian stick has many uses: a walking stick, a notification to vehicles that you are coming out of a blind alley, grabbing the attention of drivers at intersections that maybe weren't going to stop, and during the winters, a button pusher.

This is one of the many inventions that Ted has made in his 35 years in Fairview. He has upgraded his household composter, rigged up an expandable container for the back of his bicycle, and designed two new types of bikes. There is the Fun Byke, which is a slower one speed bike. The frame is one size smaller than a regular mountain or street bike, but there is an upright handlebar so that you are not hunched over as you leisurely make your way down the sidewalk.

Then there is the Rolling Byke – this is the premium addition to biking! According to Ted, riding this bike is less like walking or biking, and more comparable to cross country skiing. The frame on the Rolling Byke is two times smaller than a regular bike so that both feet can be placed flat on the ground. Like the Fun Byke, there is an upright handlebar. This a super low maintenance Byke since it has no drive system! You propel yourself on the Byke by striding and then lifting your feet up to rest while you glide down the street.

I was too much of a chicken to take it out for a spin, but my assistant did and he loved it!
