



Meet My Pet: Daisy


This came in from Sam. She has a couple of pets of her own but wanted to chat about her Granma's dog!

The last time the User Fees Policy was reviewed was 2012. Since a lot has changed over the last 10 years, we are now reviewing the current policy with the aim to have an updated policy in place for 2024.

Found in Fairview

Kathy paints and creates glass jewelry in her studio located right here in Fairview. She and her partner moved to the neighbourhood in 2020, because of the great location. It's close to everything, including her partner's work. They love going for walks around the neighbourhood and running into all the cats.

Kathy has two cats of her own that work alongside her every day. Savi is her assisstant, and Tango is the quality control manager as he loves to sit next to the printer. Unfortunately, they were unavailable for the interview, so I chatted with Kathy.

When I first walked into Kathy's studio I was struck by how neat and organized everything was and the bright vibrant colours she uses in her paintings. After speaking with Kathy, I can say that her personality was just as vibrant as the colours in her artwork.

Kathy grew up wanting to be an artist, but her dad suggested that she get a 'real job' instead, so she went to ACAD to get a graphic design degree. One of her instructors gave her some feedback she still holds dear to her heart: "You're so talented, you should really be an artist." She then focused her last semester on illustration.

Kathy grew up, got a 'real job', and became a workaholic. There was some creativity in her day job, but not a lot, and never any free time to work on her own art projects. This all changed in 2008 when Kathy was in a car accident. She was forced by her body to slow down. She came back to painting. Starting with abstract works, she let the painting be part of her rehabilitation and she really enjoyed it. In 2009, she had her first exhibit.

In 2015, Kathy was dealt another blow when she was laid off from her 'real job'. Being an optimist, Kathy put her energy and new free time into more art. She was still painting, but now had the time to try her hand at jewelry. Her friend was also having a baby around this time, so she painted the first nursery painting. Now the series has over 90 pieces!

Currently Kathy is working in her home studio, on her paintings inspired by Tiffany Lamps. These use acrylic paint and layers of glaze to mimic stained glass and are brilliant in both design and colour.

You can see more of Kathy's work by going for a walk in Marda Loop, where she has done the artwork on three utility boxes.

Back to School Safety

Alberta Health Services EMS would like to remind parents and students of some basic safety tips as the school year begins again this fall. Pedestrians and motorists both have an important role to play – road safety is a shared responsibility.

Motorists

- Distracted driving carries a \$300 fine and three demerit points in Alberta. Avoid the use of mobile devices or engaging in any other behavior that diverts your attention away from driving.
- Give right-of-way to pedestrians who have activated overhead crossing lights, or who are waiting to cross from a street corner.
- Other than parked cars, it is illegal to pass another vehicle in a school or playground zone during posted hours.

Around School Buses

- Flashing amber lights mean a bus is slowing down to stop motorists should do likewise.
- No matter which direction you are coming from, stop when approaching a school bus with activated flashing red lights – unless the bus is on the opposite side of a divided highway from you.
- Driver courtesy goes a long way. By simply being alert and cautious when approaching a school bus, you are contributing to school bus safety.

Pedestrians

- Cross only at marked crosswalks, or street corners that have clear visibility from all directions.
- Make eye contact with all drivers before crossing the street and keep distractions to a minimum.
- When activating overhead crossing lights, pause before stepping off the curb to ensure motorists in both directions have come to a complete stop.
- · Stay within the crosswalk lines.
- Obey pedestrian lights at intersections. Cross the street only when you see the 'walk' sign and only when all cars have come to a complete stop.
- If you are with young children or pets, hold your child's hand firmly and keep a solid grip on leashes when crossing.
- Remember: Children learn by observing. By demonstrating safe crossing habits, you can reduce the chances of your child being involved in a preventable auto/pedestrian collision.

Back to school with full bellies and full minds



If you're like most Calgarians, you've found yourself scrutinizing a grocery receipt or two in recent months; if you're like forty percent of Calgarians, you may have found yourself removing items from your grocery cart and placing them back on the shelf. Rising food costs mean that many of us have adjusted our shopping and eating habits. As students return to their studies this September, the Brown Bagging for Calgary's Kids (BB4CK) community will be making and delivering nutritious lunches in over 200 schools to more than 5,000 kids who go to school hungry. At BB4CK, we are committed to providing barrier-free access to the food that helps kids play, learn, and grow. Our vision is a future where communities ensure no kid goes hungry; our mission is to inspire people to take meaningful action to feed and care for kids. The BB4CK School Lunch. Program is unique because we don't ask questions of the youth who receive our lunches, we don't require them to justify their hunger, we just feed them. Nutritious lunches are prepared by volunteers in over 30 satellite BB4CK community kitchens across the city, daily. These lunches are safely delivered by volunteer drivers directly to schools in all corners of Calgary. During the month of September, BB4CK is launching our Back-to-School campaign to raise awareness and funds for our School Lunch Program and food insecurity in our city. This year, our focus is local - neighbours helping neighbours.
